Nationals Fund Raising

You've probably heard me banging on about our club corporate supporters and sponsors, and how important their support is to our ability to host the Nationals at an affordable rate. One of those companies is the wonderful team at Solid GPS, an Australian company who manufacture an affordable and reliable GPS tracking system for our cars.

Solid GPS have kindly donated three of their 'mega battery' units to the Club to raffle off. Valued at \$247 each, the Club will soon be selling raffle tickets at \$10 each. There will be 400 tickets up for grabs, with the raffle drawn as part of the Rocker Cover Racing evening in August, unless the tickets are sold out prior! We need to sell at least 250 tickets to support the Nationals but selling all 400 would be just amazing!

Tech Tip

Our little cars where built as sports cars, so drive them (occasionally) a such! They are light and relatively low geared so don't be scared to occasionally wind it out up the rev range. They actually don't like idling around the city and the occasiona spirited run will help it clear unwanted build ups off the pistons or valves. Does your car run on when you switch it off and your mechanic can't diagnose it. It may simply be that the build ups have got to a point where they are creating hotspots and causing the car to ignite the fuel-air mix after its been switched off.

A mechanically minded friend of mine and MGB guru has a simple process for cleaning the internals ... he advocates a run up the freeway from the Toll Gate to the Aldgate turn off, at the speed limit, in 3rd gear. In an MGB that's about 5000rpm for 5-6 minutes. An Adelaide interpretation of the classic 'Italian Tune Up' if you like. I'm not advocating flogging your A Series to death, but the occasional good long run at slightly higher revs may help!



SOLID GPS TRACKERS

Keen readers may remember a member talking about GPS trackers and the peace of mind a new Australian product gave him. You may also recall a short article in last years Sprouting Forth about Solid GPS.

Since then a few of us have followed suit and purchased a Solid GPS unit to help protect our prides and joy. In return, Solid GPS have come on board to help the Sprite Club of SA deliver the 2026 Nationals and have kindly donated three GPS units that the club will be raffling off across 2025 to raise funds for the Challenge - stay tuned for details early in the new year as to how you can get involved and maybe win one of the units.

How Solid GPS Works



1. Charge It.

Once you receive your tracker, charge it overnight and turn it on.

Then, download the Solid GPS app on the App Store or Google Play Store, or log in to our website.



2. Hide It.

After charging and turning your tracker on, hide it nearly anywhere inside your vehicle. Such as:

- Caravans: Inside a cupboard or drawer
 Cars: Inside the boot, glovebox, dashboard, etc
 Motorcycles: Anywhere inside your bike
- Trailers: Securely hidden under
- Boats: Inside or near the dashboard



3. Track It.

detect that movement and update your rehicle's location at its quickest, every 2 minutes. (Or up to every 10 minutes).

Then, track your vehicle 24/7 through your phone or computer.

As it has been 25 years since the last SA based National Challenge, there has been a lot of discussion and planning for this event by the Organising Committee, so we would like to keep you updated on the latest information.

As you can see by the title block the National Challenge will be held in Murray Bridge during Late April-Early May in 2026 and will provide the attendees the opportunity to enjoy the surrounds and attractions of this Riverland town.

While there are more details to follow here is an overview of the events planned for the Challenge:

- · Display Day/Show n Shine
- Social Drives and Observation Run
- Motorkhana
- Super Sprints
- Welcome and Themed Dinners
- · Final Dinner/Presentation Night

The Accommodation will be at the Bridgeport Motel in Murray Bridge, where there are a number of room options for guests, plus secure underground parking for vehicles:


